




SUPPLEMENTAL\BID BULLETIN NO.1

This Supplemental/Bid Bulletin is issued to modify, amend or clarify items in the Bidding Documents for the project: Supply, Installation, Testing and Commissioning of an Integrated Bird Deterrent and Monitoring System (IBDMS). This shall form an integral part of the bidding documents for the above-mentioned project.

The following were the queries raised by the prospective bidders during the Pre-Bid Conference held on March 31, 2017 at the CIAC Board Room, as well as the corresponding remarks or instructions made by the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) members and Office of Prime Responsibility (OPR):

Item	Queries\Clarifications	Remarks/Instructions
1.	Query from Evercon Builders and Equipment Corporation: What is the definition of similar project?	Please refer Section III. Bid Data Sheet ITB Clause 5.4, page 38 – “Similar project shall refer to a completed project that involved integration of two or more independent electronic systems”. Electronics systems are functioning integrated devices involving the flow of electrons or other carriers of electric charge, in a vacuum, in gaseous media, in plasma, in semiconductors, in solid-state and/or in similar devices, including, but not limited to, applications involving optical, electromagnetic and other energy forms when transduced or converted into electronic signals. Some examples of electronics systems are: Private Automatic Branch Exchange (PABX), Close Circuit Television (CCTV), Background Music and Public Address (BGMPA), Fire Alarm and Detection System (FADS), Communication System, Building Automation System, Navigational System, Laser System etc.


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2.	<p>Query from Maximum Solutions:</p> <p>Page 95, Item 47.1 – Spares; <i>the contractor shall supply/deliver the required spare unit/modules to ensure continuous operation and reduce equipment downtime.</i></p> <p>Does the CIAC require the supply of a mere spare part or the actual working unit?</p>	<p>The CIAC requires the contractor to supply/deliver the required spare parts or modules and not a complete functioning system. The original equipment manufacturers (OEM) have the data of these minimum spare parts to be stored in order to ensure continuous operation and reduce equipment downtime.</p>
3.	<p>Query from Maximum Solutions:</p> <p>Page 95, Item 47.5 – Spares; <i>The contractor shall submit together with its Technical Bid proposal a certification from the manufacturer ensuring the availability of spare parts for at least ten (10) years after the warranty period.</i></p> <p>Usually, the technology on bird deterrent system takes only from five (5) to six (6) years. We might not be able to secure a 10-year guarantee coming from the manufacturer as the standard warranty for bird deterrent is only 3 years.</p> <p>May we request that the guarantee on availability of spare parts of 10 years be reduced to at least 5 years?</p>	<p>Since the IBDMS involves integration of devices/equipment involving fast developing electronic technologies, Item 47.5 – Spares shall be amended and read as follows:</p> <p>The contractor shall submit together with its Technical Bid proposal a certification from the manufacturer ensuring the availability of spare parts for at least five (5) years after the warranty period.</p>

III. Additional reminders and clarifications to all prospective proponents:

1. The bidding process involves non-discretionary pass/fail criteria, whereby, if a Bidder submits the required document, it shall be rated “passed” for that particular requirement. In this regard, bids that fail to include any requirement or are incomplete or patently insufficient shall be considered or rated “failed”.
2. The original and copies of the bids shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed each pages by the bidder or its duly authorized representative/s.
3. The deadline for the Submission of Bids is on **April 12, 2017 (Wednesday)**, no later than **3:30 PM** Philippine Standard Time (PST) at the Meeting Room D, Royce Hotel and Casino, Manuel Roxas St., Corner N. Aquino Avenue, Clark Freeport Zone, Pampanga. Late bids shall not be accepted.

4. The Opening of Bids shall be conducted on the same day at **3:45 PM**, Meeting Room D, Royce Hotel and Casino, Manuel Roxas St., Corner N. Aquino Avenue, Clark Freeport Zone, Pampanga.
5. No additional documents shall be accepted by the BAC after the deadline for the Submission of Bids.
6. Prospective bidders are reminded that CIAC is VAT exempt. Thus, the bid offer or financial proposal shall be exclusive of VAT.
7. Bidders are required to make use and submit the revised Omnibus Sworn Statement form.

CIAC reserves the right to accept or reject any bid, to annul the bidding process and to reject all bid proposals at any time prior to contract award, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected or bidders.
